Program Notes

hantom of the Opera

This arrangement of Andrew Lloyd Webber's famous musical allows each ection of the choir to assume different roles within the show. Listen for conversations between characters as we present the familiar melodies of his wonderful musical. I have encourage the students to go and see Chantom this summer at Jones Hall. It is one of my favorites and well worth the price of admission.

Blood Brothers

This is a lesser known musical and one with a very contemporary musical style. Following are notes provided in our music. The story is as powerful as the music and I encourage everyone to keep an eye out for productions of this new musical by Willy Russell.

Setting: Liverpool, 1980's

Mrs. Johnstone, a single, impoverished mother of 7, gives birth to twins Mickey and Edward. While working as a housekeeper for a wealthy family, the Lyons, Mrs. Johnstone is persuaded by Mrs. Lyons to give up one of the twins to raise as her own child. Coincidently, Mr. Lyons is away for 9 months. Mrs. Lyons' deception that the baby is their own haunts her throughout her life.

At the age of seven, the brothers meet as playmates, become best friends, and through the symbolic childhood rite of exchanging blood on their fingers, they declare themselves "blood brothers." The hysterical antics of childhood games (KID GAMES) with their close friend Linda and their older brother Sammy foreshadow events in their adult lives.

Mrs. Lyons' concern over Mickey's low-life, rough-edged influence on Edward causes her to move the family to a new home in the country. Coincidently, welfare authorities evict Mrs. Johnstone and children, relocating them in the country (BRAND NEW DAY) very near where the Lyons live. The boys are reunited and grow up together, going to school with their companion Linda.

In their late teens—with encouragement from Edward—Mickey and Linda begin a romance and get married. Just before Christmas they learn that Linda is expecting a child. Mickey is let go from his factory job due to tough economic times (TAKE A LETTER MISS JONES). Destitute, Mickey allows Sammy, who has a history of theft, to help him with one last heist. Mickey is caught by the police. Sammy escapes.

During his 15-year imprisonment, Mickey develops a deep depression and consequent drug addiction. Edward, who has graduated from college and become a successful business-man/politician consoles and helps support Linda and the daughter whom Mickey has not seen. Edward and Linda confess their love (LIGHT ROMANCE) but resolve to not further it. (I'M NOT SAYING A WORD).

After finishing his sentence, Mickey returns to Linda but has a great deal of difficulty coping with the addiction and a new life. He becomes suspect of the support Edward has given Linda. In a rage, he takes a gun and goes to see Edward (MADMAN) who is in the middle of a council meeting. Mrs. Johnstone hears of Mickey's plans and goes to the meeting to stop him. In a dramatic confrontation she tells the brothers that they actually are blood brothers. Dazed and weeping, Mickey raises his arms forgetting the gun in his hand. Police shoot him, causing his gun to discharge killing Edward. Both brothers' bodies lay side by side as Mrs. Johnstone places their hands together (TELL ME IT'S NOT TRUE).
