#### **PROGRAM NOTES**

The Broadway musical Rent opened in 1996 to general acclaim, following the untimely death of its composer, Jonathan Larson, the night before. Based on the opera La Boheme, the musical traces the lives of four starving artists in New York City's lower east side in the 1990's. The song Seasons of Love is a tribute to one of the artists, who dies of a chronic illness. The musical won a Pulitzer Prize, and this song has been used in recent years to pay tribute to the fallen soldiers of the wars in Iraq and Afghanistan. We dedicate this performance to their memory.

The hit TV show Glee has brought into new focus many great songs of past generations and has stimulated nationally a new interest in vocal music in high school. Made popular by The Zombies in the 1970's, She's Not There is on Rolling Stone's list of the greatest pop songs of the twentieth century.

The Gift of Love is a setting of the American folk song The Water is Wide and is based on I Corinthians 13.

First published in 1972, it continues to enjoy great popularity among school and church choirs and is a favorite anthem for choir festivals in both the U.S. and the United Kingdom.

When the Trumpet Sounds, as recorded by the Harlem Children's Chorus, won a Grammy Award for Best Gospel Recording in 1999. Its composer, Andre Thomas, is professor of choral music at Florida State University and a frequent clinician and adjudicator at choral events in the United States and abroad.

from 1975, is considered to be the ultimate Broadway show about Broadway.

With nineteen main characters, it is set on the bare stage of a Broadway theatre during an audition for a musical. The show provides a glimpse into the personalities of the performers as they describe the events that have shaped their lives and their decisions to become actors and dancers.

The original Broadway production, directed and choreographed by Buffalo, N.Y. native Michael Bennett, was an unprecedented box office and critical hit, receiving 12 Tony Award nominations and winning nine of them, in addition to the 1976 Pulitzer Prize for Drama. It ran for 6,137 performances, becoming the longest-running production in Broadway history up to that time. It remains the fifth longest-running Broadway show ever. The show has enjoyed many successful productions worldwide and was revived on Broadway in 2006.
